MANDATORY RECYCLING All residents and businesses within Scott Township are required to recycle per Ordinance # 9-10-13. All residents must recycle: Newspaper, Glass, plastic and metal containers.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING — Each waste hauling company is required to provide a minimum of once a month recycling collection for their customers. Contact your hauler for a complete list of acceptable items, the collection schedule and fees. For more information contact the Recycling coordinator at 570-784-4532. **Authorized collectors must provide both the removal of garbage and recycling.**

The Bloomsburg Compost Site opens for the season on Wednesday March 11, 2026 (weather permitting). The site is open every Wednesday and Saturday from mid March until Thanksgiving.

Everyone entering the site must show identification as proof of address. There is no admittance outside of the scheduled open hours. The following items are acceptable: leaves, brush, branches up to six feet in length and four inches in diameter and garden residue. **GRASS CLIPPING**

ARE NOT ALLOWED. Township residents may pick up mulch or compost (while available), Loading is the responsibility of the resident.

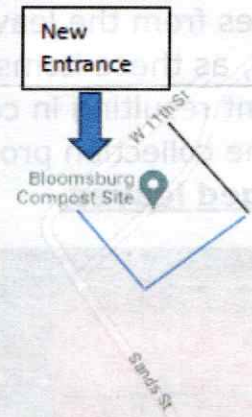

ID REQUIRED — all vehicles must stop at the attendant booth and show ID. NOTICE the traffic flow as shown above. There is no fee for Scott Township residents.

Special Note: Christmas trees can be dropped off weekdays throughout the month of January from 8:00 am until 3:00pm at the Compost Site. In addition the Township will be collecting Christmas trees at the curb in January. The 2027 dates are Jan 14th & 15th. Place tree at the curb by 7:00am free of decorations and do not bag the tree. Note only one tree per household may be placed out for curbside collection.

SPRING YARD WASTE — The Public Works department will be collecting yard waste at the curb during the **third week in April (20th–24th)**. Acceptable items include leaves and garden waste. Rake items to the curb where they will be vacuumed. Please make sure piles are free of rocks and other debris. Crews will be collecting yard waste at the curb during **this week only**. **There is no set schedule.**

FALL LEAF COLLECTION - Begins **Monday October 19th and runs until Wednesday November 25 2026**. **THERE IS NO SET SCHEDULE FOR LEAF COLLECTION.** The leaf truck has a set route to follow around the Township, and the frequency of collection along that route depends upon how many leaves are out for collection. We ask that you arrange leaves in a row instead of in a pile, and rake them to the berm of the road. Please also remove all foreign objects and stones from the leaves to be collected, as these items damage equipment resulting in costly delays of the collection process. **NO bagged leaves.**

What you should know about Flood Safety

- Make a family emergency communication plan and include pets.
- Have emergency supplies in place at home, at work, and in the car.
- Check on your neighbors to make sure they're okay.
- Know what to do before, during, and after a flood.
- Flood insurance takes 30 days to take effect, so purchase now to protect your family!
- Listen to local officials by radio, TV or social media.
- Evacuate when advised by authorities or if you are in a flood or flash flood prone area.
- If you are on high ground above flooded areas, being prepared to stay where you are may be the best protection.
- Never drive or walk through flooded streets; Turn Around, Don't Drown! Do not go through flood waters.

REMINDER— GRASS CLIPPINGS ARE TO REMAIN OUT OF THE ROADWAY. THESE ARE DANGEROUS FOR OUR STORM DRAINS, OUR MOTORISTS AND MAY CAUSE FLOODING OF ROADWAYS. PLEASE CLEAN UP ALL GRASS THAT IS BLOWN INTO THE ROAD WHEN MOWING. HELP KEEP ALL RESIDENTS SAFE.
